1. Trump incited a deadly assault on the Capitol on Jan. 6, 2021.
2. His extremist justices took away women's right to control their own bodies.
3. He wants huge tariffs, which are in effect a tax on American consumers.
4. He stole top secrets and left them in a Mar-a-Lago bathroom.
5. He bragged about grabbing the private parts of women he'd just met.
6. He called for a "day of violence" in which police could do whatever they wanted with no accountability.
7. He says his mass deportation of undocumented immigrants will be "a bloody story."
8. He pushed the fake-electors scheme to overturn a fair election.
9. He called his opponents "vermin," echoing hate speech of the Holocaust and the 1994 Rwanda massacre. 10. He invited the Taliban to Camp David.
11. He claimed you need an ID to buy cereal.
12. He pulled the U.S. out of the Paris Agreement on climate change.
13. He said a 2nd Trump administration would give a major health policy role to anti-vaxxer RFK Jr., a disturbed person who dumped a dead bear cub in Central Park and cut off the head of a dead whale with a chain-saw and strapped it to the roof of his minivan. (Really.)
14. He was friends with Jeffrey Epstein.
15. He helped the Saudis cover up the murder and dismemberment of a U.S.-based journalist.
16. He wants to use the military to put down "the enemy from within" – Democrats.
17. He thinks windmills cause cancer.
18. He lied that legal Haitian immigrants are here illegally and are eating neighbors' dogs and cats.
19. He mocked a disabled reporter.
20. He did a photo op in a restricted area of Arlington cemetery after his aides shoved aside a cemetery official who objected.
21. He used a Sharpie to doctor an official weather map rather than admit he was wrong about a hurricane hitting Alabama.
22. He lied that "Dems want to shut your churches down, permanently."
23. He said falsely that Mexico would pay for the wall.
24. His administration separated migrant children from their parents and then lost track of the parents.
25. He said he'd be a dictator, but only on "Day 1" (which is not how dictators operate).
26. He denounced Denmark's leader because she wouldn't sell him Greenland.
27. He increased the national debt by 39% in just 4 years while giving the rich a big tax cut.
28. He said of his daughter Ivanka: "She does have a very nice figure. I've said if Ivanka weren't my daughter, perhaps I'd be dating her."
29. He lied publicly that Covid-19 was "like a regular flu that we have flu shots for" while he privately said it was "more deadly than even your strenuous flu."
30. He suggested that putting light in people's bodies and injecting them w/ disinfectant could kill Covid.
31. He dined at Mar-a-Lago with Nick Fuentes, who praises Hitler and wants a "holy war" against Jews.
32. He tried to extort Ukraine to announce a probe of Biden on false allegations.
33. His Trump University paid a \$25 million lawsuit settlement for bilking students.
34. He tear-gassed a D.C. crowd protesting peacefully for social justice after the murder of George Floyd.
35. He said immigrants are "poisoning the blood of our country."
36. He lied that the U.S. murder rate "is the highest it's been in 47 years." (Not even close.)
37. He lied that he created the Veterans Choice health care program when in fact it was started by Barack Obama.
38. He lied about the crowd size at his inauguration.
39. He lied about seeing "thousands and thousands" of Arab Americans cheering in NJ during 9/11

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40. In 2005, he cited a creepy perk of owning a beauty pageant: "I'll go backstage before a show and everyone's getting dressed. . . . I'm allowed to go in because I'm the owner. . . . They're standing there with no clothes. And you see these incredible looking women."
41. He lied that Democrat-run states allow "post-birth abortions," which aren't a real thing.
42. He lied that "in New York state, if you're white, you have to go to the back of the line to get medical help."
43. He lied that Wisconsin ballots were "dumped in rivers."
44. He promised health insurance for all Americans, then failed to even present a plan in 4 years as president. He still hasn't done so.
45. He lied that "I was the person who saved pre-existing conditions in your health care."
46. He lied that Obama "founded ISIS."
47. In 2018-2019, he oversaw the longest government shutdown in U.S. history. (We tend to forget such things, don't we?)
48. He lied that "when I came into office, the auto industry was on its knees, gasping its last breaths."
49. He cheated on all 3 of his wives.
50. He made a veiled suggestion that supporters shoot Hillary Clinton: "Hillary wants to abolish, essentially abolish the 2nd Amendment. . . . If she gets to pick her judges, nothing you can do, folks. Although the 2nd Amendment people, maybe there is, I don't know."
51. He pressured Georgia's Brad Raffensperger to "find" 11,000+ votes so that he'd win the state.
52. He lied that 2 people were fatally shot in Chicago as Obama gave his final presidential address there. In fact, no one was shot in Chicago at that time.
53. He and his father were sued by the U.S. Justice Department in the 1970s for refusing to rent apartments to Black people.
54. He shoved Montenegro's leader out of the way at a NATO meeting.
55. He gave Rush Limbaugh the Presidential Medal of Freedom.
56. He fired FBI chief James Comey for refusing to stop probing Trump campaign ties to Russia.
57. After a Charlottesville white supremacy rally turned violent, Trump said there were "very fine people on both sides."
58. He urged China to interfere in the 2020 election.
59. As a candidate, he demanded a "complete shutdown of Muslims entering the U.S." As president, he banned immigration from some majority-Muslim nations.
60. He's accused of sex abuse by dozens of women, and a civil jury found that he sexually assaulted E. Jean Carroll.
61. He's obsessed with low-flow toilets, saying, "People are flushing toilets 10 times, 15 times, as opposed to once."
62. He praised Montana pol Greg Gianforte for committing a criminal assault on a reporter.
63. He said Jan. 6 was a "lovefest."
64. He pardoned co-conspirators Paul Manafort, Michael Flynn and Steve Bannon.
65. In 1984, he called a journalist on the phone, pretended he was a Trump Organization employee named "John Barron" and lied to get himself on the Forbes 400 list.
66. He urged shopkeepers to shoot people leaving their stores if they suspected them of shoplifting.
67. He declared his "respect" for North Korea's murderous Kim Jong Un and said Kim "wrote me beautiful letters and they're great letters. We fell in love."
68. During the Vietnam War, he dodged the draft, citing "bone spurs."
69. He promoted himself as self-made, not disclosing that his father gave him \$400 million.
70. He uses insults like "horseface" and "fat pig" to describe women.
71. He had to pay \$2 million in a lawsuit over the Trump Foundation's misuse of charity funds.
72. He called Mexican immigrants "rapists."
73. On 9/11 he bragged that the fall of the Twin Towers meant his building was NYC's tallest. That boast was tasteless — and false.
74. He touted his business acumen but couldn't make a profit from casinos and filed for bankruptcy six times.

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75. He said a judge in one of his legal cases should be removed because he was of Mexican descent.
76. He called Haiti and African nations "shithole countries."
77. He threatened to withdraw the U.S. from NATO, a key alliance for global stability.
78. He urged supporters to "knock the crap out of" protesters at a 2016 rally.
79. He made false statements more than 30,000 times as president.
80. He lied that an "extremely credible source" told him Obama's birth certificate was fake. After years of pushing the birtherism hoax, Trump admitted it was bunk — and he blamed it on Hillary Clinton.
81. He took Putin's word over the word of U.S. intel agencies.
82. He insulted Gold Star parents whose son, a U.S. soldier, had been killed in Iraq. It was no coincidence that the family was Muslim.
83. A NY judge found Trump and his adult sons liable for business fraud and canceled the Trump Organization's business certification.
84. He exploited the assault on a NYC jogger by taking out newspaper ads calling for the death penalty. The young Central Park 5 suspects were exonerated, but Trump never apologized.
85. He paid actors to pose as supporters at his June 2015 campaign launch event.
86. In a bizarre speech to a Boy Scout Jamboree, Trump described a cocktail party for "the hottest people in New York." He later claimed the group's leader called to say it was "the greatest speech that was ever made to them." The Scout leader denied any call happened.
87. He cheats at everything, including golf. There's a book: "Commander in Cheat: How Golf Explains Trump."
88. Trump claimed he "helped a little bit" to clear 9/11 rubble, but there's no evidence it happened.
89. He lied about being named Michigan's Man of the Year.
90. After a MAGA supporter massacred Latinos in El Paso, Trump and his wife went to the city and used a newly orphaned baby as a prop for a photo op.
91. He lied that "we're the highest taxed nation in the world." Nope.
92. He bragged about his penis size on national TV, and Stormy Daniels later fact-checked that as false.
93. He tweeted in 2019: "Today I opened a major Apple Manufacturing plant in Texas." In fact, the plant had opened nearly 6 years earlier.
94. He makes the absurd claim that people weren't allowed to say "Merry Christmas" until he came along.
95. He accused Ted Cruz's father of a role in the JFK assassination and said Cruz's wife was ugly. But Cruz is so low that he sucked up to Trump anyway.
96. He claimed he coined the phrase "priming the pump," which has been around since 1932. He said he gave Defense Secretary James Mattis the nickname "Mad Dog"; he didn't.
97. He lied that there were "205,000 more ballots than you had voters" in PA.
98. He made the U.S. a laughingstock when he gave a speech at the United Nations.
99. He denounced 4 women in Congress who are members of minority groups, telling them to go back where they came from, even though 3 were born here and the 4th immigrated as a child.
100. Former Defense Secretary Mark Esper said Trump wanted to shoot social justice protesters. "We reached that point in the conversation where he looked frankly at Gen. Milley and said, 'Can't you just shoot them, just shoot them in the legs or something?'"
101. After winning the Electoral College and therefore the presidency in 2016, he lied that he also won the popular vote. Claiming that "between 3 million and 5 million illegal votes" were cast for Clinton, he wasted taxpayer money in a failed effort to prove it.
102. He asked Vladimir Putin's regime to interfere in the 2016 election.: "Russia, if you're listening ..."
103. He wants to use the Insurrection Act to send the military into cities without an invitation.
104. He gave Jim Jordan a Presidential Medal of Freedom.
105. He so hated John McCain that the White House told the Navy to move the warship John S. McCain "out of sight" so Trump wouldn't see it in a visit to Japan.

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106. Foreign women said they illegally worked for Trump's modeling agency in the U.S. while on tourist visas.
107. He publicly feuds with his ex-officials – for example, calling ex-Secretary of State Rex Tillerson “dumb as a rock.” Who hired that guy?
108. He trashes immigrants, but when he razed a building to put up Trump Tower in NYC, he hired 200 undocumented Polish workers.
109. By refusing to disclose tax returns as other candidates did, Trump hid the fact that he paid very little in taxes. The New York Times eventually found Trump used accounting tricks to avoid paying any federal income tax in 11 of 18 years the Times examined.
110. He hates cities, though 83% of Americans live in metro areas. Baltimore is “a disgusting rat and rodent infested mess.” San Francisco is “worse than a slum.”
111. After he won the White House, he jacked up the rates at Mar-a-Lago, selling access to the president.
112. He tweeted in 2012 that climate change was a Chinese hoax.
113. He had a close association with unethical lawyer Roy Cohn, who was red-baiting Sen. Joseph McCarthy's chief counsel and was ultimately disbarred for misappropriation of clients' funds.
114. His administration took climate change info off official websites.
115. He suggested without basis that there was foul play with Justice Antonin Scalia's death: “They're saying they found the pillow on his face, which is a pretty unusual place to find a pillow.”
116. When asked at a debate why he didn't condemn the Proud Boys, he told the group to “stand back and stand by.” They stood by and later helped attack the Capitol.
117. He lied that prosecutor Fani Willis had an affair with a gang member. Utterly false and disgusting.
118. He mocked the Pelosi family after a home invader hit Nancy's husband on the head with a hammer, fracturing his skull.
119. He lied that “there were no guns whatsoever” at the Jan. 6 assault on the Capitol. This has been disproven repeatedly.
120. He refused to visit a U.S. military cemetery, saying it was full of “suckers” and “losers.”
121. He lied in 2022, “You go to a store, they don't have bread. We're like a third world country.” Trump aides ignored a request to identify the breadless stores.
121. He said in 2016 that Melania would hold a news conference “over the next couple weeks” to explain her immigration history, including how she got her Einstein visa. Still waiting.
122. He lied that the military ran out of ammo before he took over.
123. He lied that he was the 1st president to impose tariffs on Chinese goods. In fact, the U.S. collected billions before Trump took office.
124. He lied that he won the most Electoral College votes since Reagan. But Clinton, George H.W. Bush and Obama had more.
125. He lied that the strategic oil reserve was “mostly empty” and he filled it. In fact, the reserve was lower at the end of his term than at the start.
126. He lied that “the entire Database of Maricopa County in Arizona has been DELETED!”
127. He overruled experts to give a security clearance to Jared Kushner, who later leveraged his access to get \$2B from the Saudis.
128. He bathes in his cult of personality: “I could stand in the middle of Fifth Avenue and shoot people and I wouldn't lose voters.”
129. After the right demonized Anthony Fauci, Trump claimed not to know who gave Fauci a presidential commendation. It was Trump.
130. He said he got to know Putin “very well” when they were on the same episode of “60 Minutes.” But Trump was in NY, Putin in Russia.
131. Discussing the breakup of his marriage to Ivana in 1990, he said: “When a man leaves a woman, especially when it was perceived that he has left for a piece of ass—a good one!— there are 50 percent of the population who will love the woman who was left.”
132. He said in 1991: “I have black guys counting my money. ... I hate it. The only guys I want counting my money are short guys that wear yarmulkes all day.”
133. He said in 2015 he favored creation of a database to track all Muslims in the U.S.

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134. Asked in 2016 if women should be charged with a crime for having an abortion despite a ban, he said: "The answer is that there has to be some form of punishment."
135. He defended Putin in 2015: "Nobody's proven that he's killed anybody."
136. In 2016, he called for not only killing terrorists but killing their family members, too.
137. He invited Russians into the Oval Office and shared classified information.
138. He tried to revoke CNN reporter Jim Acosta's credentials because Acosta did his job.
139. His company, the Trump Organization, was convicted of 17 tax crimes, including conspiracy and falsifying business records.
140. He called for government crackdowns on MSNBC and CBS because he didn't like their coverage of him.
141. His pardon got Steve Bannon out of federal fraud charges in a "build the wall" scam. Right-wing disinformation is Bannon's game: "The Democrats don't matter. The real opposition is the media. And the way to deal with them is to flood the zone with shit."
142. He falsely accused 2 Georgia election workers of election fraud – the same allegations that led to a \$148M judgment vs. Rudy Giuliani.
143. His bid to monetize the presidency by hosting the G-7 summit at his Doral golf club sparked outrage, and he backed off.
144. As Notre Dame Cathedral burned, Trump embarrassed the U.S. by tweeting: "Perhaps flying water tankers could be used to put it out. Must act quickly!"
145. He declared publicly in 1999 that he was "pro-choice in every respect." But he tossed that aside for politics.
146. He's always been a sore loser. After Ted Cruz beat him in the 2016 Iowa caucuses, he tweeted: "Based on the fraud committed by Senator Ted Cruz during the Iowa Caucus, either a new election should take place or Cruz results nullified." Sound familiar?
147. He praised Hungarian despot Viktor Orban as "one of the strongest leaders anywhere in the world."
148. A Trump golf club put up a marker about a "River of Blood" at a Civil War battle that supposedly took place there. But no such battle occurred. It's a lie.
149. Several Trump golf clubs displayed a Time magazine cover featuring him. You guessed it: It's fake.
150. He pardoned Arizona sheriff Joe Arpaio, who had been convicted of ignoring a court order to stop profiling Latinos.
151. He tweeted about MSNBC's Mika Brzezinski "badly bleeding from a face-lift."
152. He lied about Brzezinski's husband/co-host: "When will they open a Cold Case on the Psycho Joe Scarborough matter in Florida. Did he get away with murder? Some people think so."
153. He hired Kellyanne Conway as a professional liar, and she fulfilled that role, saying early in the pandemic that Covid was "contained," calling lies "alternative facts" and referring to a terrorist attack that never happened: the "Bowling Green Massacre."
154. As he watched 2016 GOP rival Carly Fiorina on TV, he said, "Look at that face! Would anyone vote for that?"
155. He said the FBI failed to prevent a school shooting because it was "spending too much time trying to prove Russian collusion with the Trump campaign."
156. He endorsed Roy Moore for the Senate despite reports of Moore's predatory behavior toward teen girls.
157. He named Betsy DeVos as secretary of Education even though she had never worked in government or in a public school
158. He named Ben Carson to head Housing and Urban Development though Carson had no experience in housing or urban development.
159. His Labor chief, Alex Acosta, quit amid reports that as a prosecutor he cut a secret deal to go easy on sex trafficker Jeffrey Epstein.
160. His Environmental Protection chief, Scott Pruitt, resigned after ethics scandals. Pruitt ordered a government-paid aide to contact the CEO of Chick-fil-A to help Pruitt's wife get a Chick-fil-A franchise.
161. He gave Devin Nunes a Presidential Medal of Freedom.
162. His Treasury secretary, Steve Mnuchin, made such friends with the Saudis that he later cut a \$1 billion deal with them.

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163. Trump gave a White House position to televangelist Paula White, who once prayed for the miscarriage of “all Satanic pregnancies.”
164. He said if foreigners offered dirt on a political rival, “it’s not an interference. They have information. I think I’d take it.”
165. He embarrasses the U.S. with illiterate social media posts, such as calling then-Prince Charles “the Prince of Whales.”
66. He uses phrases like “brilliant” and “strong like granite” to describe China’s dictator Xi Jinping.
167. He quit the Iran nuclear deal, raising the chances of nuclear war.
168. He told his Cabinet that the Soviet Union was justified in invading Afghanistan in 1979.
169. After former Klan leader David Duke endorsed him for president, Trump said: “I don’t know David Duke. ... I just don’t know anything about him.” But researchers found video clips showing Trump talking about Duke on national TV multiple times.
170. He refused to attend his successor’s inauguration, becoming the first president to boycott the transition since Andrew Johnson in 1869.
171. He tore up official documents, forcing aides to tape them together to preserve them as required by federal law.
172. He encouraged a “lock her up” chant about Hillary Clinton and her private email server, but Trump’s daughter Ivanka and son-in-law Jared Kushner improperly used personal messaging services such as email and WhatsApp for hundreds of government communications.
173. He endorsed NC gov hopeful Mark Robinson, a Holocaust denier who called Obama a “top-ranking demon” and said “I absolutely want to go back to the America where women couldn’t vote.”
174. Trump’s social-media Christmas wish for his opponents: “May they rot in hell.”
175. He used the South Lawn of the White House for a partisan event, ignoring precedent and propriety, when he gave his 2020 Republican National Convention speech there.
176. Trump (who doesn’t attend church regularly) said Biden (who does) is “against God.”
177. In late 2020, sore loser Trump delayed transition talks with the Biden team even though the stonewalling hurt public health efforts during a pandemic.
178. Trump’s administration asked Japan to nominate him for a Nobel Peace Prize. Japan did so to curry favor.
179. Asked about QAnon, the conspiracy cult that claims JFK Jr. is still alive and Democrats kidnap children to harvest their blood, Trump said: “I don’t know much about the movement other than I understand that they like me very much, which I appreciate.”
180. He lied that U.S. Steel was building 6, 7, 8 or 9 new plants (the number varied). But the company built no new plants.
181. He was asked about charges vs. Ghislaine Maxwell for conspiring with sex predator Jeffrey Epstein. Trump said: “I wish her well, frankly.”
182. He bragged that he received “the highly honored Bay of Pigs award” from Cuban Americans in Florida. There’s no such award.
183. He retweeted a GOP pol’s post suggesting duct-taping Nancy Pelosi’s mouth so “she won’t be able to drink booze on the job as much.”
184. After a 75-year-old social justice protester in Buffalo, NY, was shoved to the ground by police and suffered a fractured skull, Trump suggested it was a “set-up” by “an antifa provocateur.” Trump tweeted that the activist “fell harder than [he] was pushed.”
185. A 1973 New York Times story said Trump “graduated first in his class” from Penn’s Wharton School. Nope. It was an early case of media swallowing Trump lies.
186. He said about Covid in June 2020, “If we stopped testing right now, we’d have very few cases, if any.”
187. He encouraged police to be more violent. After describing how police put their hand over a suspect’s head to prevent them from injury as they’re loaded into a police car, Trump said, “You can take the hand away, OK?”
188. He lied that Obama spied on his campaign.
189. In an example of casual lying, Trump said: “We will be ending the AIDS epidemic shortly in America and curing childhood cancer very shortly.”
190. Trump’s Agriculture Dept. ordered staff to stop referring to “climate change” and call it “weather extremes” instead.

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191. In unprecedented behavior for a presidential hopeful, he is selling watches, crypto and sneakers.
192. He secretly shipped Covid test equipment to Putin when it was needed in the U.S.
193. There is credible evidence that Egypt gave Trump's campaign a \$10M bribe.
194. He says he'd withhold aid and let California burn if the governor opposed him politically.
195. He opened most of Alaska's Tongass National Forest to logging and other development, removing protections for a temperate rainforest. Biden reversed the move.
196. Trump's coup attempt projected such instability that Gen. Mark Milley assured his Chinese counterpart that the U.S. planned no attack. This infuriated Trump, who suggested Milley deserved execution: "In times gone by, the punishment would have been DEATH!"
197. As he plotted to keep power despite losing in 2020, Trump considered naming conspiracy crackpot Sidney Powell as a special counsel to "investigate" the non-existent voter fraud he claimed. Powell later pleaded guilty to conspiring to interfere with an election.
198. Trump's "God Bless the USA" Bibles were printed in China.
199. Trump wants to pardon the rioters who beat up police officers at the Capitol.
200. Trump did nothing but watch for 187 minutes as his followers stormed the Capitol. Why? Because he liked it.

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
